









# CHELSEA space: Five Years Running

The radical, reaching and cutting-edge CHELSEA space is celebrating its fifth birthday. Five weeks of performances, exhibits, questions and histories will be held this month, including big names and sharp artistic insight, jotta spoke to guest curator and experimental performance artist Bruce Mclean about his contribution.



Should I Stay or Should I Go? is a celebration of the CHELSEA space exhibition-zone; a space, forming part of the Chelsea School of Art's territory, that has brought London a series of challenging, confrontational work - often in the fo of performances, archives, projects, and other hard-toclassify schemes.

space anniversary is impressive. But even more enticing is the range of performances, acts, rehearsals and preparations, alongside the "beginnings", 'snapshots' and 'updates' of works; all we can expect from the heavy weights of this (often under-represented) side of the art world.

The ex-head of graduate painting at the Slade, Bruce Mclean, will be running the bar for the opening night, 38 years, to the day since his 'King for a Day' 24-hour retrospective at the Tate Gallery, which took place on 11th March 1972.

Bruce told jotta of his plans, which continue on the 12th and 13th March, when he will be constructing sets for a project, Test Bed 1, and doing some 'pose-training' (see his previous 'Pose Work for Plinths' and 'Nice Style' movement).

Then, on the 25th March will be 'A Hot Potato Against A Dark Background', a new work by Bruce Mclean featuring a potato, a ball gown, a hole, a moving goal mouth and a large collapsing fireplace. From the 11th onwards Bruce Mclean will have work featured in CHELSEA cab, the portable gallery driven by avid art collector and true possesor of 'the knowledge' Jason Brown, which will be parked up outside the CHELSEA space.

Curation for the exhibition is being handled by RUN gallery; the guest curators are also to include Mick Jones (ex-Chelsea College student).
